John Hattie

John Hattie, Ph.D., is an award-winning education researcher and best-selling author with nearly 30 years of experience examining what works best in student learning and achievement. His research, better known as Visible Learning, is a culmination of nearly 30 years synthesizing more than 1,700 meta-analyses comprising more than 100,000 studies involving over 300 million students around the world. He has presented and keynoted in over 350 international conferences and has received numerous recognitions for his contributions to education. His notable publications include *Visible Learning*, *Visible Learning for Teachers*, *Visible Learning and the Science of How We Learn*, *Visible Learning for Mathematics, Grades K-12*, and, most recently, *10 Mindframes for Visible Learning*.



Heath Peine

Heath Peine is the Director of Professional Learning, Learning Services at Corwin, where he leads efforts to deliver high-impact professional learning that empowers educators and improves outcomes for students. With experience spanning teaching, instructional coaching, and district leadership, Heath brings a practitioner's perspective to his work. He has led system-wide improvements through initiatives such as PLC+, Visible Learning, Teacher Clarity, and MTSS. Now, he partners with school and district leaders nationwide, helping them drive meaningful change through evidence-based practices.



Empowering Students Through Math Progressions: Leading Their Own Learning

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In this session we will define motivation in simple actionable terms. The session will help leaders and teachers approach resistance and “lack of motivation” with curiosity rather than judgement. Participants will move from conflict to collaboration as they have opportunities to reflect on and discuss how the session strategies can be applied to their own experiences and contexts. Specifically, participants will learn about the three faces of motivation, the motivation equation, and multiple strategies for increasing motivation through increasing value and/or decreasing effort.



This session explores how math progressions can be used as a powerful tool to help 5th-grade students take ownership of their learning. By making standards transparent and breaking them into clear, student-friendly progressions, teachers can guide students in setting goals, monitoring their growth, and reflecting on their progress over time. Participants will learn practical strategies for integrating progressions into classroom practice, see examples of student data tracking tools, and leave with ideas for fostering student agency, motivation, and a growth mindset in mathematics.

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

